

Bailey has been a patient in my office since October 6, 2010. She arrived with a previous diagnosis of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, combined type. I concur with this diagnosis. In addition, she appears to suffer from Oppositional Defiant Disorder and a possible Mood Disorder. I was informed that your school would administer intellectual testing to rule out a possible learning disability.

Michelle, Bailey's mother, requested that I write this brief letter. I believe Bailey will benefit from a 504 plan. A daily academic tracker will possibly improve communication. Also, due to the ADHD, Bailey will likely benefit from occasional extra time for getting assignments turned in. She may also perform better on tests if she could take them outside of the classroom, in a quiet location, with extra time.
