This letter concerns the above referenced Development. I have had a chance to review the plan(s) and have the following comment(s): Written responses to the following comments are required.

- 1. To do a complete review more information is needed on the submitted plat or an additional plan. Below is a list of a few items that need to be shown to do a review.
- 2. Existing utilities need to be shown.
- 3. All public utility, drainage and irrigation easements need to be shown on the plat.
- 4. Natural drainage along the back of the lots needs to show 50ft, from high water mark. (43-2 Stream Corridors, Wetlands, and Shorelines)
- 5. There is an existing well shown on the plat. Is there a protection zone for this well? Does this supply culinary water to anyone?
- 6. Contours need to be shown on the plan.
- 7. The paved surface needs to be shown on the plan.
- 8. What is the ROW width?
- 9. The location of all structures or buildings immediately adjacent to the subdivision need to be shown.
- 10. There does not appear to be any way for the storm water to be conveyed off the roadway. Please show how the storm water will be conveyed or place a note on the plat that states lots will accept the storm water. See County Standards http://www.co.weber.ut.us/engineering/pdf/PublicWorksStandardsandSpecifications.pdf
- 11. All other items under 1-5 of the subdivision ordinance "Preliminary Plan Requirements and Approval Procedure" need to be shown on the plat. When it comes for final it will need to follow section 1-8.
- 12. There more than likely needs to be an improvement plan created to show some of these items, where they typically are not shown on a plat.
- 13. The State now requires that a National Discharge Pollution Elimination Systems (NPDES) permit be acquired for all new development. A copy of the permit needs to be submitted to the county before final approval. Permits can now be obtained online thru the Utah State Dept. of Environmental Quality at the following web site: https://secure.utah.gov/swp/client.
- 14. A Storm Water Activity Permit will need to be obtained through our office before construction begins. http://www1.co.weber.ut.us/mediawiki/images /5/56/Stormwater_Construction_Activity_Permit.pdf
