A Special Event Permit is hereby authorized subject to the Utah Department of Transportation $_{\dot{c}}$ s (UDOT $_{\dot{c}}$ s) Special Events Rule (Utah Administrative Code R-920-4) and any other applicable laws or regulations. All permit terms, conditions, and limitations (TC&L $_{\dot{c}}$ s) set forth herein are binding and in full force. Failure to abide by all permit TC&L $_{\dot{c}}$ s is grounds for immediate permit revocation, the restriction of future permits in accordance with Utah Administrative Code R920-4-5, or other legal remedies as prescribed by law.

By carrying out the activities authorized by this approval the permittee and the permittee as event participants accept and agree to all terms, conditions, and, limitations, of the approved permit including any attachments submitted with the Special Event Permit Application. By carrying out the activities authorized by this approval the permittee agrees to dutifully execute and carry out all form completion requirements as specified in Utah Administrative Code R920-4-9(4) including the retention of all participant-signed Waiver and Release of Damages forms for a period of no less than 12-months.

The permittee shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless UDOT from all damages or claims, including attorneys fees, arising out of any and all actions performed under this permit by the permittee, the permittee, semployees, agents, or contractors, including failure to comply with the TC&L¿s listed on this permit. In accordance with Utah Administrative Code R920-4, the permittee is responsible to pay all appropriate permit fees.

PERMIT TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND LIMITATIONS

- 1. A copy of this permit must be posted in a conspicuous location and be available for immediate review at the location of the permitted activity. No exceptions.
- 2. This agreement and/or permit is UDOT approval only. The permittee is responsible for obtaining clearances, authorizations, or permits from railroads, private property owners, other utility owners, and other government agencies as may also be required.
- 3. By the accepting this permit, the permittee acknowledges the hazardous nature of conducting activities within the right-of-way and assumes full responsibility in the event of an accident or other incident involving death, injury, or damages to any party resulting from the permittee's authorized use of the right-of-way.
- 4. All work performed under this permit must be in accordance with UDOT approved plans and standard drawings unless otherwise stated in writing.
- 5. The primary function of the highway is for transportation purposes. All other highway purposes are subordinate to this primary purpose. By conducting the activities authorized by this permit, the permittee agrees to timely prosecute the permitted activities in a manner that minimizes transportation-related impacts including but not limited to; ensuring overall site safety as an overarching priority, and by applying systematic efforts to minimize, or shorten, the project schedule.
- 6. UDOT may cancel, suspend, or revoke this permit due to:
 - A) Non-compliance with the permit provisions including terms, conditions, and limitations
 - B) Deviating from the approved permit provisions without written authorization
 - C) Misrepresentation(s) discovered on the originating application, or associated documents
 - D) Adverse weather or traffic conditions
 - E) Concurrent transportation construction or maintenance operations in conflict with the permit
 - F) Any condition deemed unsafe for workers or for the traveling public
 - G) Any other condition that arises where work stoppage may be warranted for cause

In the event of a cancellation, suspension, or revocation the permittee shall promptly terminate occupancy of the right-of-way.

- 7. At all times the permittee and all activities authorized under this permit will comply with all applicable federal and state constitutions, law, rules, codes, orders, and regulations, including applicable licensure and certification requirements.
- 8. Use current edition of UDOT standard drawings for traffic control. Use Utah MUTCD standards for traffic control elements not shown in UDOT standard drawings. Traffic control must be maintained at the encroachment site for the entire encroachment period.



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- 9. Contact local municipalities regarding your planned special event and provide UDOT with direct contact information for identified points of contact.
- 10. In Utah, a bicycle is considered a vehicle and must abide by the same rules of the road. All riders must ride no more than two abreast and must not impede traffic if doing so.
- 11. Bikers are expected to wear reflective clothing when riding at night. Bicyclists must be equipped with a white light on the front and a red reflector on the back of their bike.
- 12. Snell, ANSI, or ASTM approved helmets must be worn by all participants.
- 13. Applicant certifies that all participants have signed a Waiver and Release of Damages against the State of Utah for participation in an approved special event on State Roads.
- 14. Permittee shall thoroughly police and clean up the highway after the event to ensure all event-generated litter is effectively removed.
- 15. Notice to the public of any road closure must be given in advance of the event, as determined by Regional Permit Officer, by advertising through radio or newspaper.
- 16. All special event advertising is prohibited within the right-of-way. Off-premises advertising on private property is limited by, and subject to, Utah's Outdoor Advertising Act.
- 17. Spectators must be kept a safe distance from the participants to view this event.
- 18. No pavement markings or removal of signs are allowed.
- 19. Any motorized vehicle in the parade must be operated in a safe manner by a licensed driver. Due to inherent life-safety hazards, the practice of throwing candy to the parade spectators is prohibited. The use of a spotter is always recommended.
