You are hereby notified that your request for final approval of Anselmi Acres Subdivision Phase 1 (33 lots) located at approximately 4100 West 1400 South was heard and approved by the Weber County Commission in a public meeting held on December 19, 2023. Approval was granted conditioned upon meeting all requirements from county reviewing agencies and the following conditions:

1. The donation to the parks district listed in the development agreement will be paid by the developer before the Phase 1 subdivision plat records.
2. The applicant will provide a cost estimate for all subdivision improvements including street trees and pathway improvements, to be reviewed and approved by county staff before the subdivision plat records.
3. The final approval letter from Hooper Irrigation or a plat signature before recording.

This recommendation is based on the following findings:

1. The proposed subdivision conforms to the Western Weber General Plan.
2. The proposed subdivision complies with applicable County ordinances.

Time limitation for plat recordation. A subdivision plat shall be recorded in the Office of the County Recorder within one year of final approval by the Land Use Authority. After that, the plat shall have no validity. Subdivisions with multiple phases must record a new phase within one year from the date the previous phase being recorded until the subdivision is completed or the plat shall have no validity. The planning director may grant a one-time extension for final subdivision approval, for a maximum of one year. A multiple phase subdivision may receive only one time extension, not one time extension per phase. One additional time extension may be granted if the hardship is determined to be a county caused delay.
